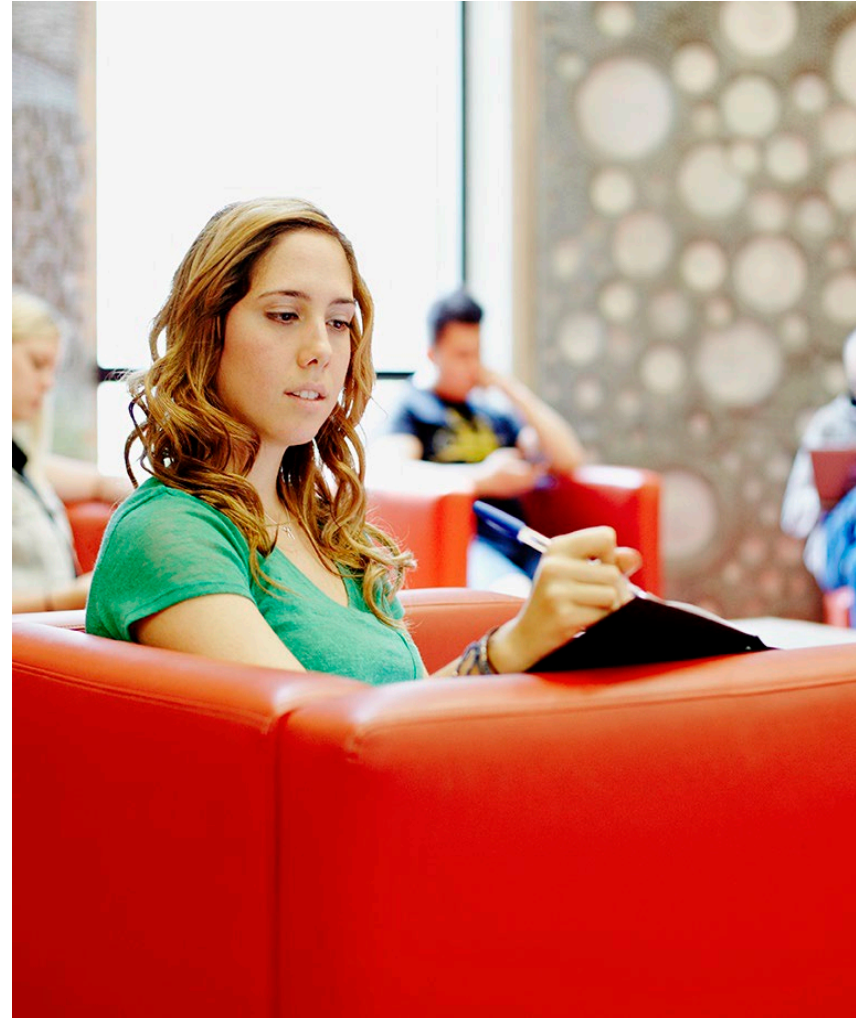

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### Overview and Practicum

#### Overview

The Bachelor of Education (BEd) at York University is designed to be a place where theory and practice are deeply linked and where foundations and methods courses and school and community experiences speak to one another. It consists of 10 full courses (60 credits) delivered over a period of four semesters, and includes required courses, a community placement, practicum placements, and elective courses. The program is structured around four broad themes – one for each semester:

- Orientation to the profession in community
- Learners
- Classroom and Curriculum
- Schooling, Society and Research.

#### Practicum Experiences

You will begin your practicum experience in the first year with both a community placement and a school-based placement. These complementary placements support the development of community-based practice, reflecting our Faculty's foundational belief in the relationship between school and community. These placements will allow you time to observe, relate, reflect and deconstruct your understandings of teaching and learning with a focus on links between theory and practice. In year one you will spend one day per week in each placement. In the second year you will undertake a school-based placement with both weekly days in placement and teaching block experiences. We are confident that these experiences will help you become exemplary teachers who are engaged in the facilitation of learning for Ontario students.

## **Consecutive Teacher candidates**

Was your degree already conferred when you applied?

Official transcript(s) are required if:

- You are graduating in spring or fall 2024, and/or
- You did not send official transcript(s) when you applied or
- You uploaded a transcript into MyFile.

## **Official Transcripts need to be received by July 15, 2024**

- York U. students do not need to send in transcript(s)

**Concurrent Teacher candidates** Maintain a 5.0 grade point average and no more than 12.00 credits outstanding in their undergraduate degree. Course grades used for teaching subject certification are no less than a C+.

# ATTENDANCE

## **Bachelor of Education Teaching Certification**

It's important to remember that the B.Ed. is a full-time academic program that has a very full schedule, and the degree is accredited as an in-person program. With the professional nature of the program and expectations from the Ontario College of Teachers (OCT), it is expected that students attend classes together to enrich their learning experiences and to prepare them to enter the teaching profession.

80% of your B.Ed. courses will have a maximum 45 students allowing Course Directors to ensure teacher candidates are active participants in the class discussions. Students need to be fully present.

# ACADEMIC SUPPORT TOOLS

If you encounter problems while in the program:

Discuss with your Course Directors **as soon as possible** to determine what action you need to take.

Book an appointment with your Education Academic Advisor if necessary

- **Petitions:** Student requesting a change to a rule/regulation
- **Deferred Standing Agreement:** Student requesting an extension of course work or practicum requirement(s). This is an arrangement agreed by both instructor and student.

# Police Record Check/VSS

All Teacher Candidates (TCs) enrolled in a B.Ed. program must have a valid Vulnerable Sector Screening (VSS) for every year in the program.

- ✓ At the start of the program in September, all TCs must have a cleared VSS document.
- ✓ TCs must re-apply for a new VSS prior to the expiry date of the existing one every year.

# EXPERIENTIAL EDUCATION - Practicum

## Year 1 Practicum placements

**School** – Experience working collaboratively with a mentor teacher in school-based practicum placements (begins mid October). One day per week and culminating days during last two weeks of April.

**Community** – Studies in Communities and Their Schools (Seminar and Placement, full academic year). One day a week.

# PLACEMENT INFORMATION

## What will I do while in placement?

The first year will focus on the development of professional understandings and relationships within the school community. **Teacher Candidates will have responsibility for participating actively for the whole school day, undertaking a range of experiences** such as working with small groups and/or individual students, deconstructing their understandings of teaching and learning with a focus on links between theory and practice, facilitating classroom transitions, co-planning and co-teaching with the mentor teacher, and engaging in lesson study. Teacher Candidates will also have the opportunity to experience different school settings (divisions, non-classroom, rotary, ELL, special education, etc.) throughout the year.

- SMILE! This will be an outstanding year. We look forward to sharing the journey as you become an exemplary teacher.

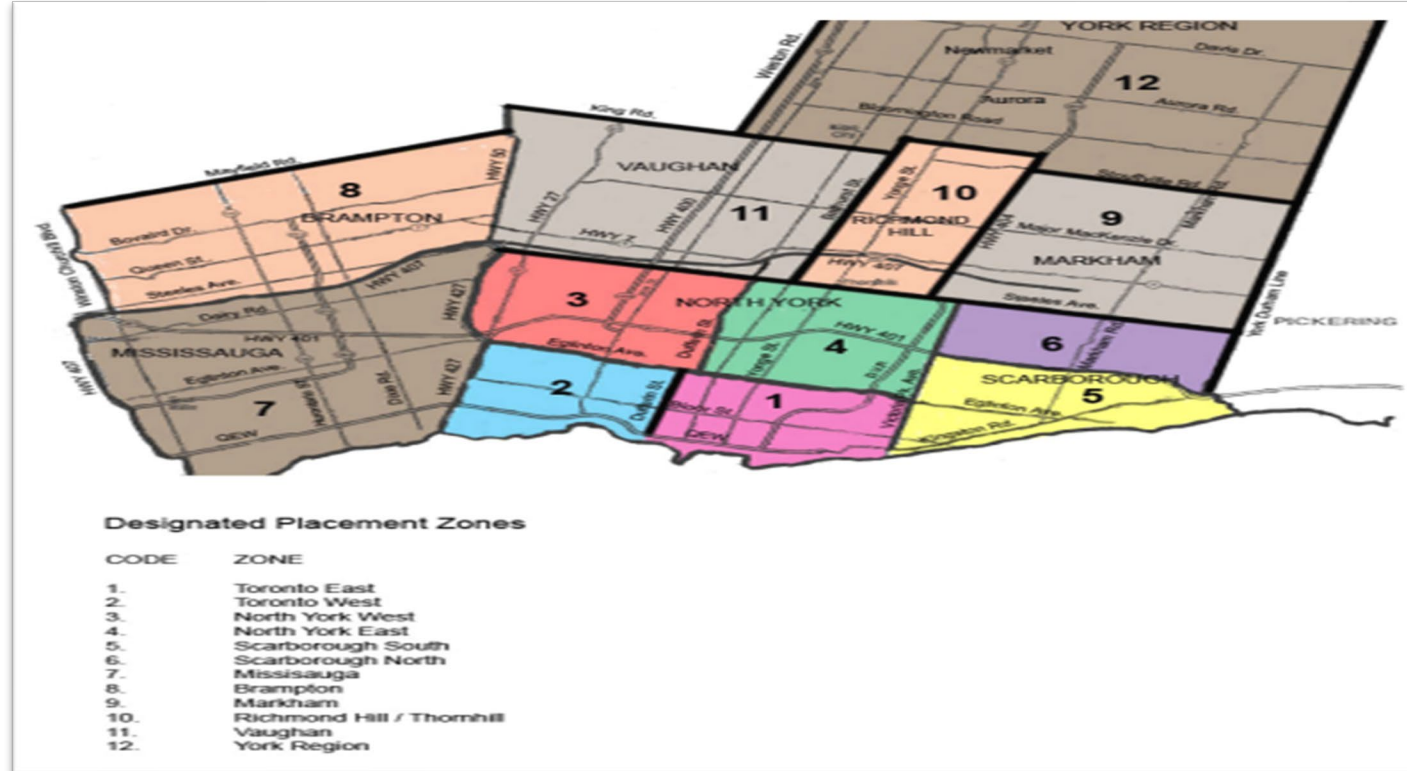
